Capacity Building Presentation: Responding to Adverse Childhood Experiences in Monroe

Joe Neigel presented on Adverse Childhood Experiences. ACEs are significant childhood traumas that result in actual changes in brain development, which are shown to impact a child's learning ability, social skills, and result in sometimes significant long-term health problems. Exposure to childhood ACES can increase the risk of:

- Alcoholism
- Grade Repetition
- Suicide Attempts
- Depression
- Heart Disease
- Teen pregnancy

- Domestic Violence
- Illicit Drug Use
- Unemployment
