Call to Order

Monroe Community Coalition full membership meeting was called to order at 1PM by Tom MacIntyre.

• Needs Assessment Round Robin

Coalition members broke into small groups to share their perspectives on the strengths and challenges facing our community. This preliminary needs assessment provides a lense through which the coalition will examine Healthy Youth Survey data when it is released later this spring. Small groups rotated to seven stations and recorded their thoughts in response to the following questions:

- 1. What's great about living or working in Monroe?
- 2. What concerns or worries do you have for our community?
- 3. What do you think has a positive impact on youth in our community?
- 4. What do you think has a negative impact on youth in our community?
- 5. What factors do you think contribute to underage drinking and other substance abuse in our community? Have there been any changes in the community that might influence use?
- 6. What specific resources/agencies do we have in our community to help us address the issues impacting youth?
- 7. What resources are missing or too difficult to access that could help us with these issues?

The Coalition will revisit the round robin process in April to examine the specific risk and protective factors identified in the Annual Community Survey, the Healthy Youth Survey and the DSHS Department of Research and Data Analysis' Community Risk and Protective Factors report.

Sectors of Support – Leadership Team Report and Consensus

- 3. Movie night at the Galaxy Theater (Screenagers)
